#### Building and Grounds Report – submitted by Nick Forenz Annual Report for year 2015

In 2015, we took on three major projects. The first was replacing our landscaping on three sides of the building. We had a great volunteer force turn out to help remove the old plant and prepare the site for the new plants. The volunteers, working with the contractor helped to save a considerable amount of money. A few folks also helped with the layout and planting of the new design. We have received many compliments on the new look, many of them complimenting on how clean the look is and how much they like being able to see the cornerstone on the front of the church. The project was funded through a combination of monies from Arlene Santus's memorial funds and some other monies donated specifically for the project.

Our second large project in 2015 was the re-lining of the chimney. Gregg Learned spent hours working with the current owner and employees of Collins and Walton who finally determined that the liner put into the chimney during the Undercroft Renovation had not been installed properly and in fact was the cause of most of our furnace issues including the high levels of CO andCO2 detected last winter. They managed to beat the cold weather with the installation of the new liner and so far so good.

The third major project was the installation of a new sound system and camera. This new digital system produces excellent sound quality and volume no matter where you are sitting in the church. It also is compatible with most hearing aids so we no longer need the special amplifier units. The final part of the project, to be completed in the Spring of 2016 is the installation of speakers in the Bell Tower.

A grab bar was installed on the wall for the steps going from the Sacristy to the Office.

As is the case every year we did our usual share of yearly maintenance that keeps the church looking good and operating safely.

Lawn watering Trash removal Snow Removal Outdoor flower upkeep Light bulb changing Fixing a loose or broken something

Making sure the TVs, sound system and cameras are working

To this list, as always, we can add the things that get done that no one is aware of because someone steps up and takes care of them before anyone else takes notice. Many thanks, to all our solicited and unsolicited volunteers. We all appreciate your efforts to keep the church in good repair, and looking great.

Several planned projects are already planned for 2016:

- Install new lighting in the Sacristy
- Clean/shampoo the carpets and chairs in the Undercroft
- Paint the walls in the Flora Keeler room
- Put up a fireproof backsplash behind the new stove
- Install an Ansul Fire Suppression System in the kitchen
- Repair of the Handicap entrance door
- Reconnect Sacristy Drain to dry well
- Repair ruts in front lawn

2015 was another busy year from a maintenance and grounds-keeping perspective with a lot being accomplished by a relatively small volunteer force. As always, as we check items off the list we add new ones and we are confident that people with the appropriate talents will continue to step forward to help whittle down the 2016 list.

Thanks again to all who do their part. We would not be able to operate this building without your efforts.

### Christmas Stocking – submitted by Lynne Sharp Annual Report for the year 2015

Mary White was given a list of Hammondsport students who were in need of some Christmas cheer and we came up with the idea of the Christmas stocking. When all was said and done we provided gifts for five families that included eleven children.

### Loaves and Fishes Food Pantry – submitted by Sue Lange Annual Report for the year 2015

110 Christmas boxes were distributed. The cost for food for each basket came to \$25.82 each.

40 Easter Gift Certificates were given out.

The cost for turkeys given out for Thanksgiving this year came to \$638.75 We also received some free turkeys from the food bank.

In 2015 we served 539 households and 1,539 total patrons.

# Programs 2015

 Bible/Book Study (The Rev Gary Edmister) – The Book study that we attending following Bible Study has been part of St James for quite a long period of time. It is normally attended by anywhere from five to ten people and has covered a large range of topics over the years. We have studied the writings of C. S. Lewis, The Gospel According to Peanuts by Robert Short and most recently Walking the Bible by Bruce Feiler. The study is intended to reflect on our Christian core values and our faith journey from perspectives other than our own. Everyone is welcome ad it doesn't require an advanced degree in theology to attend.

- Coming out and going in (Joan Rogerson) Our desire is to be an open and visible presence in the community. During community events such as the Art Show, Craft Show, and Boat Show we have staffed an outside table on the side of the church (or in the case of the Boat Show at the property of Mr. Kingham near the head of the lake) to hand out free water and key fobs that both have our church label. We also have the church open for tours at those times. Our docents are given a packet that contains church history and answers for the most frequently asked questions. We also had a public Christmas hymn sing in the church prior to the beginning of Christmas in the Park. Although living in Savona, Reverend Lynne has also made a great effort to be visible in the community. Our church is open for prayer from 10-2 on Thursdays with a service at noon and she can also frequently be seen out and about in the village.

- Newsletter (Joan Rogerson) The newsletter comes out every other month. Reverend Lynne writes the articles for the newsletter and then it is sent on and put in newsletter form. Once that is completed, email copies and links are sent out and hard copies are runoff for those who do not receive the email form or link. If you

- Sunday School (Lin Bretherton) I shop at either Michaels, or Hobby Lobby, Walmart, or Jo-Anne Fabrics for kids crafts, sometimes on sale. The internet offers a multitude of craft ideas where I can try to connect with the seasons and the Sunday sermons. Two "adults" in the Sunday School room help the kids to stay connected with the lessons. Most Sundays, the amount of kids range from one or up to seven. Our Missionary Piggy bank helps the kids to think about our Christian brothers and sisters around the world. The kids are asked if there are family members or friends that need prayer, we add them to the prayer list, and keep them on the white board. Music therapy connects with parts of the brain that aids in memory retention. Helping the kids to learn scripture through song will remain in their minds and hearts forever. YEA!
- Youth Group, Hammondsport Community (Karen and Jim Derr) St. James has supported the Hammondsport Community Youth Group this year. The youth group met twice a month from September through May at the Methodist Church for students in Grades 7-12. Attendance ranges from 10-34 young people; some who attend area churches and many who do not attend regular services. Many St. James parishioners contributed food, supplies, and their time to support a worthwhile group of young people in our community. Tom Bidwell continues to be relied upon for his inspirational music. Some members also contributed items like candy and baked goods for the "goodie bags" given to each student at the Christmas party. In addition, we split the cost of teen study bibles that were given to each student who attended the year end party in May. Rev.
